What will I study?

This program will provide you with practical and professional skills in all aspects of project management. There are six courses, including the integration project. All courses are compulsory and may be completed uninterrupted in 14 weeks, or over several terms up to a maximum of two years.

The courses are designed to be taken in sequence so you can progressively work through a project from initiation to closeout. The program finishes with a practical integration project, which provides an opportunity to demonstrate the skills developed throughout the program.

PROJECT INITIATION AND CHARTER DEVELOPMENT

Learn the terminology, processes and approach to formal project management. At the end of this course, you'll be able to:

- Identify project requirements
- Establish effective project objectives
- Define a project manager's responsibilities
- Create a project charter

PROJECT PLANNING, SCHEDULING AND BUDGETING

Develop valuable project planning skills by creating a comprehensive project plan. At the end of this course, you'll be able to:

- Document project deliverables accurately
- Break down work to a manageable level
- Estimate task and resource needs
- Develop a realistic and optimized schedule
- Create a comprehensive project budget

Learn to closeout a completed project or phase and how to implement continuous improvement for future projects.

- Complete administrative and financial closure
- Transfer the project to operations
- Capture lessons learned
- Improve project management for future projects

PROJECT MANAGEMENT INTEGRATION PROJECT

Apply the various concepts skills and experiences from all of the previous courses to a comprehensive and integrated project. This is the final course in the program and it includes the final exam.

HOW MUCH WORK IS INVOLVED?

You should plan to spend about 12-15 hours per week working through the course content, activities and assignments. These are average numbers based on feedback from hundreds of students who have taken the program, but each student's experience will be different depending on their prior experience, their efficiency with the tools, and their time constraints.

WHO IS THIS PROGRAM FOR?

This program was created for anyone interested in learning to manage projects better. You don't have to be in a project management position, but many students are working as project managers, supervisors or project coordinators. It helps if you have experience working on projects in some capacity so you can put the learning in context, but it doesn't matter what industry you work in.

Past participants have come from diverse backgrounds and include those with no experience managing projects to people with more than 30 years' experience managing large, multi-year projects. Some participants have little formal education, while others have advanced degrees and their Project Management Professional (PMP)® credential already. One thing common to all of them – they all say they've learned a lot from this program.

HOW WILL THIS PREPARE ME FOR MY PMP®?

The PMP® credential requires education, project management experience, training, and a final exam. This program provides almost six times the required project management training, and all the content aligns with the most current version of A Guide to the Project Management Body of Knowledge, (PMBOK® Guide).

WHAT ARE THE PREREQUISITES?

Courses must be taken in sequence, even if you intend to spread them out over several terms – you must complete the previous course in the sequence before you can take the subsequent course. Other than that, you must have a reasonable level of computer literacy and sufficient proficiency in English to communicate your learning in your assignments.

WHY IS THIS PROGRAM BETTER THAN OTHERS?

Many other project management programs are designed for technical audiences, and they give students a generic case study to work on with a team. Sometimes working as part of a team means students only learn their part of an assignment instead of all the skills, and working on a case study may not be applicable to your field or industry.

In our program, you choose your own project to work on and complete individual assignments. This means you'll learn all of the skills, not just some of them. Plus, you'll be using a project familiar to you, rather than an unrelated case study.

HOW DOES ONLINE LEARNING WORK?

Online learning in this program is called asynchronous, which means you don't need to be online at the same time as the instructors or other participants. Courses are accessible from anywhere there's an internet connection – past students have studied from all over the world, including from a camp in the middle of the Amazon jungle! Study at a time and place that's convenient for you and your schedule.

Courses are divided into modules that follow a weekly schedule. Each week, you'll learn one or two modules, and complete a practical assignment to apply the skills learned that week. This helps pace your progress through the courses to ensure that you're able to learn without falling behind. Modules include readings, online videos, samples, templates, exercises, and an assignment to help you learn the techniques, see how they're applied to a sample project, and then practice using the skills on a project of your own.

Our program also uses a wide variety of tools, like discussion forums, blogs, wikis, group activities, and email to increase collaboration between you, other participants and the instructor. Instructors are also available by appointment for consultation by phone or online chat. You can feel confident you'll be guided through the learning process as much or as little as you prefer.

HOW IS THIS PROGRAM RECOGNIZED?

You can be assured that you'll learn the most up-to-date project management skills. Also, past students have received credit for this program towards undergraduate and graduate degrees through prior learning assessment, but the final decision on credit award is always up to the granting institution.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

You'll receive a percentage grade for each course. All marks are awarded based on completion of written assignments in each course. The final course consists of an integration project and final exam, which covers all of the material learned in the program.

WHO ARE THE INSTRUCTORS?

All courses are taught by working professionals with more than 20 years' experience in management and teaching. Each instructor holds the Project Management Professional® (PMP)® credential and has managed projects in a wide variety of industries, so you'll receive real-world instruction focused on your learning needs.

Two instructors are assigned to a cohort each term, so you'll receive consistent feedback throughout the courses and get to know them well.
