How do I know which courses to take?

How long will it take to complete the certificate?

This varies depending on how many courses you take each semester.

3 courses per semester: finish in 4 semesters (under 1.5 years)
Fall-Winter-Summer-Fall

2 courses per semester: finish in 6 semesters or 2 years
Fall-Winter-Summer-Fall -Winter-Summer

What is the cost of the program?

There is no program fee when studying part-time. As a part-time student, you can take 1, 2 or 3 courses at a time in any given semester. Payment is per course, as you register. The course fees change year-to-year and course to course. The best source for accurate fees is to check the website:
